
Women's equal access to labor market will generate US\$12 trillion –equal to US and China economies

Women's participation in boards correlated with larger returns in investment






the intended impact of interventions is to increase access to energy for economic empowerment and provide pathways out of

## **GENDER-RESPONSIVE Approach**





#### <u>1</u>.

- Literature review
- Analysis of country's policy framework/ institutional initiatives on gender & forest
- Compilation of sexdisaggregated data on forest use & management, land and tenure rights
- Surveys, interviews and questionnaires

## <u>2.</u>

- Enhance the engagement of women and women's organizations in the development of gender roadmap
- Back-to-back training session is needed to build both technical knowledge and women's confidence on CC themes
- Identify women's priorities, where appropriate

### <u>3.</u>

- Ensure women's participation in mapping exercises and analysis
- Definition of CC options

#### <u>4.</u>

- Technical offer for women needs
- Women benefits- beyond household
- Not only micro

#### <u>5.</u>

- Collect gender disaggregated data
- Learn from implementation
- Redesign accordingly
