

# Integrated governance, finance and transparency for delivering climate goals

## **CONFERENCE AGENDA**

This Conference is a 3-day practical exchange for government practitioners and policy decision makers from over 60 countries preceded by a high-level reception of the German Federal Government at the German Federal Ministry for the Environment (BMUB) the evening of 2 May and followed by an excursion to the surroundings of Berlin 6 May. Over 250 participants are expected to attend with representatives from government as well as from selected multilateral and bilateral institutions, think tanks, and private sector networks.

#### **Conference Objectives**

The Conference will advance the implementation of NDCs and low emission development strategies globally and nationally, by

- sharing emerging practices, especially in the areas of: integrated governance to achieve development and climate change mitigation and adaptation goals; financing and transparency;
- identifying gaps and opportunities for support;
- exploring concrete opportunities for countries to progress their NDCs and LEDS through collaboration and linkages to sustainable development and the 2030 Agenda;
- engaging with private sector climate networks to explore needed actions.


