#### **EVOLUTION OF REPORTING — MRV — TRANSPARENCY (DEVELOPING COUNTRIES)**

- Reporting under the Convention (UNFCCC)
  - Show efforts undertaken or planned in implementing the Convention
  - Form: National communications
- Bali Action Plan Measurement, Reporting and Verification (MRV)
  - Enhanced national/international action on mitigation (e.g. NAMAs) in conjunction with enhanced reporting (MRV)
  - Biennial update Reports (BURs) and International consultation and Analysis (ICA)
- Paris Agreement Transparency Framework
  - Clear understanding of climate change action (NDCs and adaptation) and support
  - Inform global stocktake: assess collective progress towards achieving longterm goal under the agreement

#### **Technical expert review**

#### All Parties (shall)

Undergo technical expert review of information submitted under Art.13.7

## Multilateral facilitative consideration

 Multilateral facilitative consideration of progress with respect to efforts under Art 9 (financial resources) and implementation & achievement of NDC

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#### FEW LESSONS LEARNT & CHALLENGES IDENTIFIED UNDER CURRENT MRV ARRANGEMENTS

- 36 non-Annex I Parties have submitted their 1<sup>st</sup> BUR (since Dec 2014) and 5 have submitted 2<sup>nd</sup> BUR
  - Submission of BURs according to agreed timeline seems still challenging for many Parties (both for 1st and 2nd BUR)
- Generally, BURs are comprehensive & consistent with the guidelines and provide a good picture of efforts (GHG emissions, mitigation actions, constraints &challenges, and support needed and received)
- Many countries show ambition in their **reporting on GHG inventories** (time series/recalculations; use of 2006 IPCC GL and higher tiers; provisions of additional information; key category analysis and uncertainties, QA/QC and improvement plans)







#### FEW LESSONS LEARNT & CHALLENGES IDENTIFIED UNDER CURRENT MRV ARRANGEMENTS

- Quite some diversity in the presentation of the information
  - ➤ E.g. Reporting of **mitigation actions** varies greatly, such as in terms of level of detail and formats used (methodology and underlying assumptions)
  - E.g. level of explanatory information/data provided as part of GHG inventory
    - > Due to scope and level of detail in UNFCCC reporting GL?
- The institutionalization of inventory preparation and systematization of domestic MRV arrangements still appears to be a challenge in many countries
- Lessons learned &good practices useful experience for next BUR and ICA and on-going work on modalities, procedures and guidelines for the ETF
