Join the announcement of the Renewable Energy for Latin America and the Caribbean (RELAC) initiative. RELAC brings together the Latin American and Caribbean (LAC) countries on a joint effort to scale-up renewable energy in the region as a contribution to the achievement of the Paris Agreement. Ten LAC countries have committed to this regional initiative and others are considering participation.

RELAC sets a collective regional target of at least 70% of renewable installed capacity by 2030. This amounts to 312 GW of renewable installed capacity, of which 78 GW comes from new capacity prioritizing the use of non-conventional renewable energies. Get inspired by this regional initiative!
