Group 1 How can long-term ambition drive short term action? How to prioritize, e.g. hard to abate versus low hanging fruit? How to improve alignment between short-term action and LTS?

- How can long-term ambition drive short term action?
- How to improve alignment between short-term action and long-term vision?
- How to prioritize, e.g. hard to abate (e.g. long-term) versus low hanging fruit (e.g. short-term)?
- How to support cross-institutional cooperation on NDC and LTS planning, e.g. transport, finance, energy and environmental ministries working together to establish common targets?
- What can climate planning learn from energy planning? How to better integrate Energy and Environmental Govt. leads on climate targets and pathways?
- How can the existing energy planning framework help support the creation of a policy and regulatory environment fit for the implementation of NDCs and LT LEDS?

Group 2 What kind of planning and analyses and new approaches can best inform concrete near-term action and increased ambition?

- What types of analyses and tools are most effective to inform planning for NDC and LT-LEDS implementation?
- Where have we seen sectoral or cross-sectoral collaboration and planning successfully resulting in increased ambition?
- How can we break barriers of traditional methods and thinking to achieve real climate action?

Group 3 How should international support and finance step up more in the near term to accelerate energy transition in developing countries?

- What types of international support are most needed and effective to support LTS and near-term action (finance, TA, modeling, stakeholder engagement)?
- How can the G20 process/proposal for Global Coalition on Energy Planning support this?
- What are key challenges and lessons learned from not so effective international cooperation?
- What are key successes and recommendations from successful international cooperation to support LT LEDS and NDC?

Group 4 How can bottom-up stakeholder engagement support top-down higher ambition and implementation?

- How can subnational efforts, strategies, and implementation plans be integrated into national strategies to help ensure national success and define NDC/LT-LEDS?
- How can stakeholder engagement (with diverse set of stakeholders, incl. citizens, academia, industry and financial actors) foster the development of more ambitious and actionable strategies?
- How can we better facilitate inputs from private sector and civil society to inform NDC and LT LEDS?
